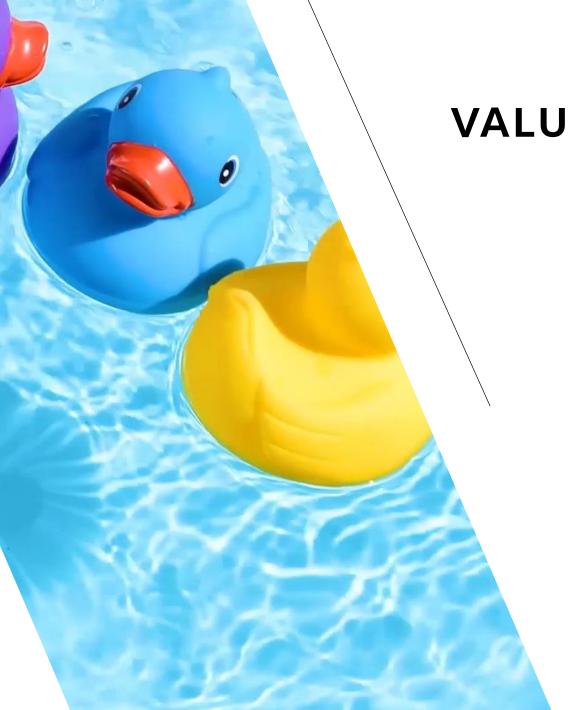






Pool opened July 4, 1965 Funds provided by private/ public donations

VALUE OF THE POOL-ISSUES

□ Season of only 8 – 10 weeks

- 2021 June 4th August 7th Closed 6 days
- 2022 May 29th August 7th Closed 8 days
- 2023 May 29th August 8th Closed 9 days
- 2024 May 27th August 9th Closed 10 days

VALUE OF THE POOL-ISSUES

- □ Start of school year (1st part of August)
- Availability of home pools
- Access to nearby pools
- Lack of additional features
- Expensive pool liners required

OPTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT – APRIL 2023

Meet minimum milestone investment - \$950,000
 Compressed scale - \$2,500,000

Premium investment - \$4,500,000

OPTION 1 – MINIMUM INVESTMENT

Cost \$950,000

- New circulatory gutter system
- Pool shell interior
- Reconfigure pool & deck layout
- New mechanical operational equipment
- Pool deck safety equipment
- Referendum tax impact \$24 to \$95

OPTION 2 – COMPRESSED SCALE

Cost \$2,500,000

- Shallow depth leisure pool
- Zero entry with splash features
- **Two flume water slide**
- □ Referendum tax impact \$63 to \$251

OPTION 3 – PREMIUM INVESTMENT

Cost \$4,500,000

- One diving board 1 meter
- □ Three flume water slide
- New concrete deck
- **Zero depth entry**
- □ Five hoop rain spray
- Climbing wall
- **D** Zip line
- □ Referendum tax impact \$114 to \$452

UPDATE 2025 – MINIMUM INVESTMENT

Cost \$950,000

- Stainless steel circulatory gutter system
- PVC Pool membrane surface interior
- Pumps, filtration, chemical feed
- □ State of the art mechanical equipment
- Double flume water slide
- □ All required safety equipment including ADA

UPDATE 2025 – OPTIONAL UPGRADES

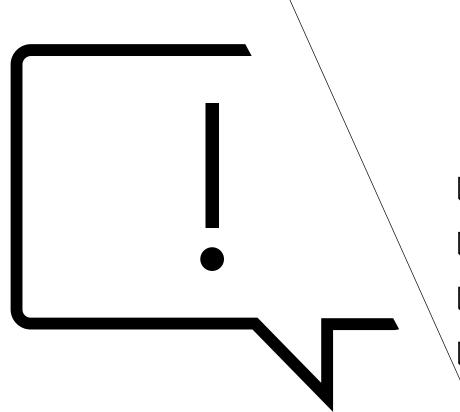
- □ Floating lily walk
- 5 unit shade structures
- Climbing walls
- Lounge/deck furnishings
- **D** Zipline
- Competitive swim package

UPDATE 2025 – OPTIONAL UPGRADES

Zero entry splash poolLazy river

\$450,000 \$850,000



PUBLIC REACTION/COMMENTS:
