The survey consisted of 10 questions. Survey results will be presented at the July city council meeting but I would like to share the results here as well. In total there were 443 responses although some questions had less answers. One question allowed for open answers while the rest had limited response. Here are the results:

Question 9 had several options to choose from, in addition an opportunity to provide other options was provided. The most selected responses of the provided options were: add lighting to facilities (238), increase beautification (221), add/improve trails (215), improve drainage (246) and update shelter houses (237). There were 110 Other responses submitted. The most frequent response was to add fencing around the small children play areas. Other frequently mentioned responses were the pool, splash pads, pickleball courts, dog parks and open restroom facilities. The complete list will be made available as part of the completed plan. It is the responsibility of the Park Board to act on the results of the survey.

It is clear Humphreys Park is a valuable asset to the community. Upkeep and maintenance of the park is the joint responsibility of city employees, Park Board members and the Pride in the Park organization. Their efforts are greatly appreciated in making the park what it is today. Personally, I enjoy seeing families using the parks' facilities whenever the weather allows. It is tragic when a few community members trash the restroom facilities on a regular basis making them unavailable for all to use. It's your park, enjoy it!
